Does "Doubting Thomas" get a bit of a bum rap? I'm not saying he didn't doubt. I'm just a little surprised that he gets singled out as THE "doubter" when all his fellow disciples were guilty of the same sin. Think of how often and how plainly Jesus had told those disciples that he "...must go to Jerusalem...be killed and on the third day be raised to life" (Matthew 16:21-23). And yet, as those very events unfolded, to a man, every disciple doubted. All of them fled and deserted Jesus. They all denied and disowned him – all of them!

Then, came reports of Jesus' resurrection, and what did the disciples do? They still doubted. They dismissed the reports as nonsense and hid behind locked doors. They were sad and depressed. They were paralyzed by fear and insecurity. Why? The Risen Lord explained it perfectly when he told the Emmaus disciples: "How foolish you are and how slow to believe all that the prophets have spoken!" (Luke 24:25).

It wasn't just Thomas. Despite all that they had seen him do, every one of Jesus' disciples doubted him. How very sad! Sadder still is the fact that we must add our names to the list. So often we fail to take Jesus at his Word. Ignore his warning. Doubt his promises. Like those first disciples, our doubts lead to stress and worry. They fill us with fear, insecurity, and guilt.

But there is hope for those who doubt. "Peace be with you!" (John 20:21) Jesus says to us. This is the peace he himself earned for us by shedding his blood, by suffering our hell, and by conquering the last enemy, death!

What does this mean? This special week, Jesus will open the Scriptures for us. Our hearts will burn within us has we hear of his love for us. Treasure the forgiveness he speaks in Word and Sacrament. Jesus will do away with doubt and worry. He will calm our fears. He will fill us with peace and joy. And Jesus will use us to bring all this wonderful message of hope to others.

So, don't doubt! Jesus has done it all. And on Eastern Sunday we will once again proclaim with shouts of Alleluia. **He is risen! He is risen indeed!**

³ Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. ⁴ Both were running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. ⁵ He bent over and looked in at the strips of linen lying there but did not go in. ⁶ Then Simon Peter, who was behind him, arrived and went into the tomb. He saw the strips of linen lying there, ⁷ as well as the burial cloth that had been around Jesus' head. The cloth was folded up by itself, separate from the linen.

¹³ They asked her, "Woman, why are you crying?"

Jesus appears on the road to Emmaus

¹³ Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem. ¹⁴ They were talking with each other about everything that had happened. ¹⁵ As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them; ¹⁶ but they were kept from recognizing him.

¹⁷ He asked them, "What are you discussing together as you walk along?"

They stood still, their faces downcast. ¹⁸ One of them, named Cleopas, asked him, "Are you only a visitor to Jerusalem and do not know the things that have happened there in these days?"

¹⁹ "What things?" he asked.

"About Jesus of Nazareth," they replied. "He was a prophet, powerful in word and deed before God and all the people. ²⁰ The chief priests and our rulers handed him over to be sentenced to death, and they crucified him; ²¹ but we had hoped that he was the one who was going to redeem Israel. And what is more, it is the third day since all this took place.

²² In addition, some of our women amazed us. They went to the tomb early this morning ²³ but didn't find his body. They came and told us that they had seen a vision of angels, who said he was alive. ²⁴ Then some of our companions went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but him they did not see."

²⁵ He said to them, "How foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! ²⁶ Did not the Christ have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?" ²⁷ And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was

said in all the Scriptures concerning himself.

²⁸ As they approached the village to which they were going, Jesus acted as if he were going farther. ²⁹ But they urged him strongly, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them.

³⁰ When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. ³¹ Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight. ³² They asked each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?"

³³ They got up and returned at once to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven and those with them, assembled together ³⁴ and saying, "It is true! The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon." ³⁵ Then the two told what had happened on the way, and how Jesus was recognized by them when he broke the bread.

Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe."

²⁸ Thomas said to him, "My Lord and my God!"

²⁹ Then Jesus told him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."


