Constitution/By-Law Amendment The Church Council has recommended a By-Law amendment to Article 9 "The Board of Education." It will be presented for a vote at the Annual Voters Meeting on January 31. The wording to be added to the article is as follows:

"Up to two seats on the five-member board of education may be filled by members of area churches whom we share fellowship and have children in the St. John school. Those outside board of education members have a vote on the board of education, but do not have a vote on the full church council nor are they voting members of St. John Church. Any board of education candidate from another congregation shall be elected at a meeting of the voting members of St. John. Additionally, up to two non-voting advisory members of the board of education may be appointed by the church council. Those advisory positions may be filled by St. John members or members from our fellowship congregations."

1 Samuel 3:1-10

SECOND LESSON

1 Corinthians 6:12-20

12 "All things are permitted for me"—but not all things are beneficial. "All things are permitted for me"-but I will not allow anything to control me. 13 "Foods are for the belly, and the belly is for foods, but God will do away with both of them." However, the body is not for sexual immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord is for the body. 14 God raised up the Lord and will also raise us up by his power. 15 Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then remove the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? Certainly not! 16 Or do you not know that he who is joined to a prostitute is one body with her? For it says, "The two will become one flesh." 17 But he who is joined to the Lord is one spirit with him. 18 Flee from sexual immorality! Every sin that a person commits is outside the body, but he who commits sexual immorality sins against his own body. 19 Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit, who is within you, whom you have from God?
