Sunday School We are still looking for Sunday School Teachers. If you are interested in helping let Pastor Sar-



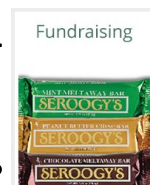

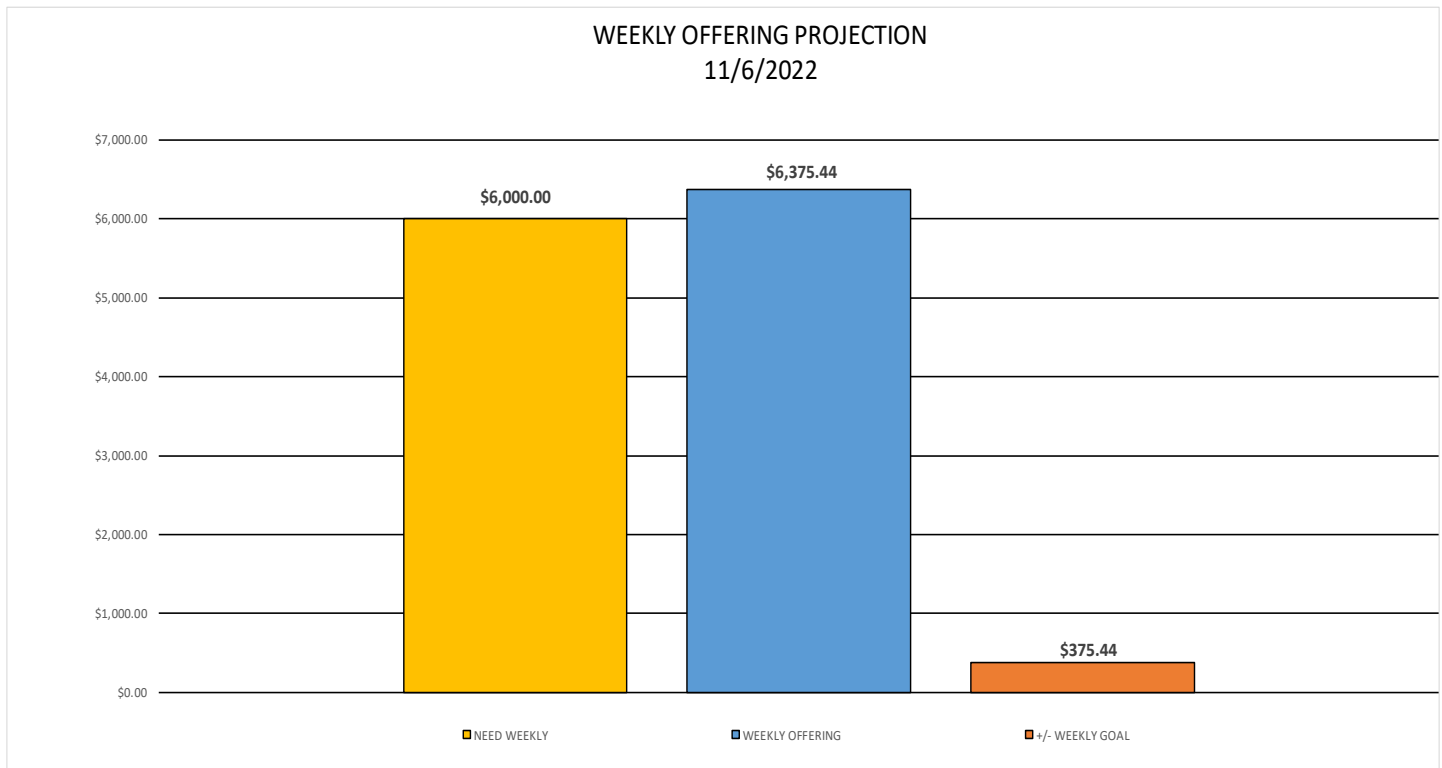

Our school's first semester mission offering for this school year is going to the Thai Village Inc., a nonprofit organization that works with artisans in Thailand (Southeast Asia) to support economic self-sufficiency and Christian education.

During the month of September we had a mission presentation by Pastor Jud Krohn and his wife Barb, who served as missionaries in Thailand and were instrumental in helping establish the Thai Village organization. As part of our continuing support this semester, along with our weekly chapel offerings, we are having a display of some of the products that are made by the artisans at Thai Village which will be available for purchase. The display will be set up in the church narthex starting next Sunday, November 20 through Sunday, November 27. We will also have the display available for the joint Wednesday, Thanksgiving worship service on November 23. Coffee and donuts will be served after the Wednesday night service while you have the opportunity to browse and shop the craft display. FIRST LESSON**ISAIAH 65:17-25**

17 Watch this! I am about to create new heavens and a new earth. The former things will not be remembered. They will not come to mind. 18 Instead, rejoice and celebrate forever, because of what I am creating. Watch this! I am about to create Jerusalem to be a source of gladness, and her people will be a source of joy. 19 I also will be glad because of Jerusalem, and I will rejoice over my people. The sound of weeping will not be heard in her again, nor will the sound of crying. 20 There will never again be an infant there who lives for only a few days, or an elderly man who does not fill out all his days, for one who dies at a hundred will be considered a young man, and one who fails to attain the age of one hundred will be regarded as cursed. 21 Then they will build houses and live in them. They will plant vineyards and eat their fruit. 22 They will not build a house and have another person live in it. They will not plant and have another person eat the crop, for the days of my people will be like the days of a tree, and my chosen ones will enjoy all the work of their hands. 23 They will not labor only to receive nothing, and they will not give birth to children doomed to disaster, for they will be offspring who are blessed by the LORD, and their descendants will be with them. 24 Then even before they call, I will answer. While they are still speaking, I will hear. 25 The wolf and the lamb will graze together, and lions will eat straw like cattle, but the serpent will eat dust as its food. They will not harm or destroy anywhere on my holy mountain, says the LORD.

PSALM OF THE DAY**PSALM 150 (PAGE 122)****SECOND LESSON****2 THESSALONIANS 2:13–3:5**

13 But we are always obligated to thank God for you, brothers, loved by the Lord, because God chose you from the beginning for salvation by the sanctifying work of the Spirit and faith in the truth. 14 For this reason he also called you through our gospel so that you would obtain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. 15 So then, brothers, stand firm and hold on to the teachings that were passed along to you, either by word of mouth or by a letter from us. 16 May our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who loved us and in his grace gave us eternal encouragement and good hope, 17 encourage your hearts and establish you in every good work and word. 3:1 Finally, brothers, pray for us so that the word of the Lord may spread quickly and be glorified just as it was among you. 2 Pray also that we may be rescued from evil and wicked people. For not everyone has faith. 3 Still, the Lord is faithful. He will establish you and protect you from the Evil One. 4 We also have confidence in the Lord concerning you, that you are doing and will continue to do what we are telling you. 5 May the Lord continue to direct your hearts to God's love and Christ's patient endurance.

GOSPEL


LUKE 20:27–38

27 Some of the Sadducees (who say there is no resurrection) came to him. 28 They asked him a question, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies leaving a wife but no children, his brother should take the wife and raise up children for his brother. 29 So there were seven brothers. The first took a wife and died childless. 30 The second took her as a wife, 31 and


so did the third, and in the same way the seven died and left no children. 32 Finally the woman died too. 33 So in the resurrection, whose wife will she be? For the seven had her as a wife.” 34 Jesus said to them, “The people of this age marry and are given in marriage. 35 But those who are considered worthy to experience that age and the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. 36 In fact, they cannot die any more, for they are like the angels. They are sons of God, because they are sons of the resurrection. 37 “Even Moses showed in the account about the burning bush that the dead are raised, when he called the Lord: ‘The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob.’ 38 He is not the God of the dead, but of the living, for all are alive to him.”
