

PSALM OF THE DAY SECOND LESSON

PSALM 139b (page 117) HEBREWS 2:9–11

9But we look to Jesus (the one who was made lower than the angels for a little while, so that by God's grace he might taste death for everyone), now crowned with glory and honor, because he suffered death. 10Certainly it was fitting for God (the one for whom and through whom everything exists), in leading many sons to glory, to bring the author of their salvation to his goal through sufferings. 11For he who sanctifies and those who are being sanctified all have one Father. For that reason, he is not ashamed to call them brothers.

VERSE OF THE DAY Alleluia. I will proclaim your name to my people; in the midst of the congregation I will praise you. Alleluia. (Hebrews 2:12 cf. RSV)

GOSPEL MARK 10:2–16

2Some Pharisees came to test him and asked, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife?" 3He replied, "What did Moses command you?" 4They said, "Moses permitted a man to write a certificate of divorce and send her away." 5But Jesus told them, "He wrote this command for you because of your hard hearts. 6But from the beginning of creation, God made them male and female. 7For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, 8and the two will become one flesh. So they are no longer two but one flesh. 9Therefore, what God has joined together, let no one separate." 10In the house his disciples asked him about this again. 11He said to them, "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her. 12If she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery." 13Some people began bringing little children to Jesus so that he would touch them. But the disciples rebuked them. 14When Jesus saw this, he was indignant. He said, "Let the little children come to me! Do not hinder them, because the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. 15Amen I tell you: Whoever will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it." 16And he took the little children in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them.
