

Now, please forgive the offense of the servants of the God of your father." Joseph wept when they spoke to him. 18 His brothers also came and fell down in front of him, and they said, "See now, we

are your servants." 19 Joseph said to them, "Do not be afraid, for am I in the place of God? 20 You meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring this to pass and to keep many people alive, as it is this day. 21 Now therefore do not be afraid. I will nourish you and your little ones." He comforted them and spoke to them in a kind way.

PSALM OF THE DAY SECOND LESSON

PSALM 103 (PAGE 105)ROMANS 14:5–9

5 One person values one day above another. Another person values every day the same. Let each person be fully convinced in his own mind. 6 The person who honors a certain day does this for the Lord, and the person who eats does this for the Lord, because he gives thanks to God. And the person who does not eat does this for the Lord and gives thanks to God. 7 In fact, not one of us lives for himself, and not one dies for himself. 8 Indeed, if we live, we live for the Lord, and if we die, we die for the Lord. So whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord. 9 For this reason he died, rose, and lived, to be Lord

of both the dead and the living.

VERSE OF THE DAY Alleluia. Everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope. Alleluia. (Romans 15:4)

GOSPEL MATTHEW 18:21–35

21 Then Peter came up and asked Jesus, "Lord, how many times must I forgive my brother when he sins against me? As many as seven times?" 22 Jesus said to him, "Not seven times, but I tell you as many as seventy-seven times. 23 For this reason the kingdom of heaven is like a king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants. 24 When he began to settle them, a man who owed him ten thousand talents was brought to him. 25 Because the man was not able to pay the debt, his master ordered that he be sold, along with his wife, children, and all that he owned to repay the debt. 26 "Then the servant fell down on his knees in front of him, saying, 'Master, be patient with me, and I will pay you everything!' 27 The master of that servant had pity on him, released him, and forgave him the debt. 28 "But when that servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him one hundred denarii. He grabbed him and began choking him, saying, 'Pay me what you owe!' 29 "So his fellow servant fell down and begged him, saying, 'Be patient with me, and I

will pay you back!' 30 But he refused. Instead he went off and threw the man into prison until he could pay back what he owed. 31 "When his fellow servants saw what had happened, they were very distressed. They went and reported to their master everything that had taken place. 32 "Then his master called him in and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you all that debt when

you begged me to. 33 Should you not have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had mercy on you?' 34 His master was angry and handed him over to the jailers until he could pay back everything he owed. 35 "This is what my heavenly Father will also do to you unless each one of you forgives his brother from his heart."
