


Dear Parents,

For the upcoming school year, 2022-2023, we will be planning a number of field trips. The Department of Public Instruction (DPI) requires us to either use a certified bus company for our transportation, or we can use teacher and/or parent transportation, if those drivers have State approved background checks.

All of our staff at the school have already completed these background checks.

We, however, are looking for parent volunteers who would be interested in helping to drive for some of the smaller group field trips. To be able to do this, you would have to have a background check done. The cost of this would be covered by the school.
