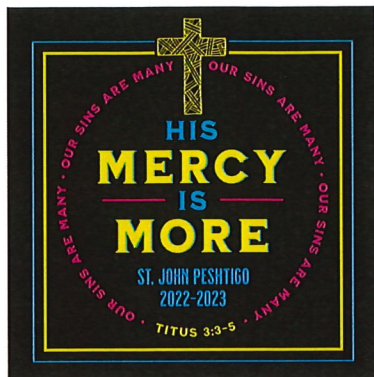

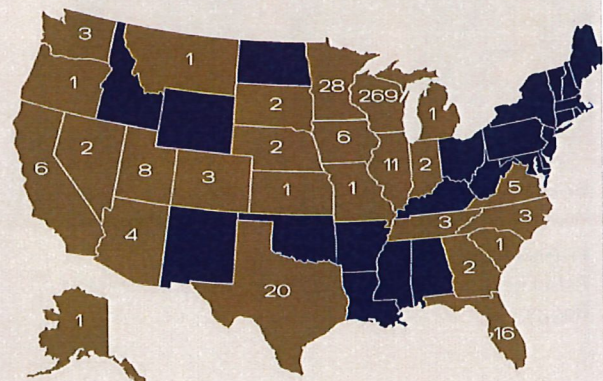

MINISTRY DAY A HIGHLIGHT OF FALL

Every fall, Luther Prep students enjoy a special event called "Ministry Day." It's a day without normal classes or homework, but it's not a day off. Instead of learning math, science, and history, students get to learn about different kinds of gospel ministry. Instead of their usual professors and instructors, students hear from two dozen pastors, teachers, and church members who have specialized forms of ministry.

Ministry Day begins with a special worship service, followed by several interesting and inspiring presentations. Topics for younger students include: a day in the life of a pastor or teacher, introductions to Martin Luther College and Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary, how to talk about Jesus in your everyday life, and the joys of serving in the public ministry. Older students can learn about staff ministry, teaching early childhood, teaching high school, bilingual ministry, prison ministry, life as a vicar, lessons from a new teacher, even how to use Zumba dance classes to reach out to your community (dancing included!).

Why call this day "ministry" day? Ministry means service, and we can best serve others by sharing Jesus with them. Ministry Day is all about finding YOUR way to serve others by bringing them Jesus. That's why Luther Prep exists: to encourage students to share Jesus with others as pastors, teachers, staff ministers, and witnesses for Jesus.

Our students enjoy the change of pace (and the chance to sleep in!) which Ministry Day brings. But really, they love Ministry Day because it informs, excites, and motivates them to find THEIR ministry. **That's what Luther Prep is all about!**

*HSPT WHAT IS THIS & WHY?

HSPT stands for High School Placement Test. It's a standardized test used to gauge a student's academic abilities. Luther Prep administers the HSPT as part of our enrollment process, and the test results are exceedingly helpful as we place students into appropriate classes. Our goal is for students to be challenged, but not overwhelmed, in their classes. The HSPT is one tool we use to achieve that goal.

To help prospective students, Luther Prep offers the HSPT on campus three times each year. If students live more than 75 miles from LPS, we'll arrange for a teacher to proctor the test at their school. This year's on campus test dates are **November 19th, January 7th, and April 15th**.
