

What's the Buzz in K-2? 10/10/22

In Christ-light this week we will learn about two people that Jesus met and taught one-on-one. Our first lesson will be about Jesus teaching Nicodemus. Nicodemus was a Pharisee who met with Jesus at night so the other Pharisees would not know about his interest in Jesus' teachings. Kindergarteners are continuing to learn about the letter Aa and Superkid Alf. Each day when we begin our reading lesson I work with the children on phonemic awareness. We do different word games to help them with rhymes, taking apart words into their individual sounds, and figuring out the first sound of a word. The kids are doing a good job of identifying the beginning sound for

words that begin with C, O, G, and A. We have also started listening and identifying the middle sounds in words with the short a and o. This week we will finish our A book and start the next unit on the letter D.

In first grade the students are working on Unit 2. This unit focuses on words with the "th" and "wh" sounds. At this age many children often pronounce the "th" sound as an "f" sound. I've been emphasizing that the "th" sound is made with sticking out your tongue, while the "f"

sound is made with your tongue in your mouth behind your teeth. I encourage you to check how your child says words that start with the "th" sound and make sure to remind them to use the correct lip and mouth position for it. **Their spelling test is on Friday, October 14.**

Second Grade is learning about words that end with -ss, -s that sounds like a z, and -z. Their spelling test is on Friday, October 14.

In the first part of October we learn about **Fire Prevention.** This week we are learning about fire safety. We will talk about the importance of never playing with matches or lighters, being very careful around anything that heats up, and what to do if your clothes catch on fire. We will learn about fire drills and how they work at school. Coming up this week we will be having an all-school fire drill and a visit from two of our area volunteer fire fighters. This is a great opportunity to talk to your child about fire safety at home, how they would leave their bedrooms in case of a fire, and where your family meeting spot is. Along those lines of staying safe, please make some time to practice your phone number and address with your child. Make sure they always know what number they should call to get hold of you.
