



Notes and News from Mrs. Myslik's K-2s

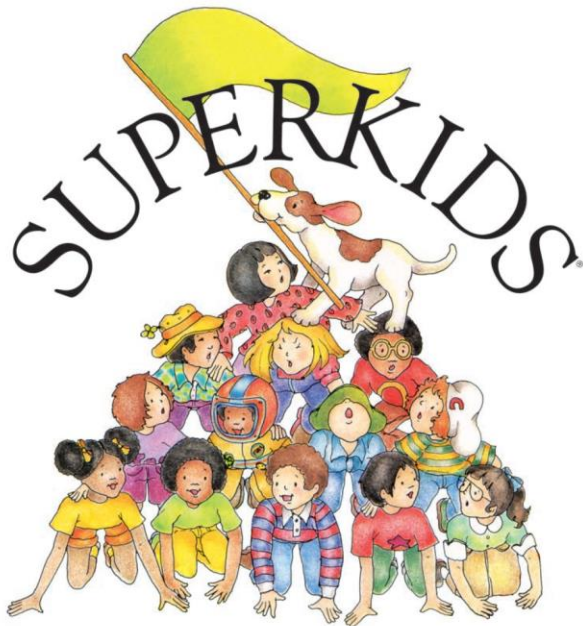
