

Notes and News from Mrs. Myslik's K-2s November 15, 2021

During Bible History this week we are continuing the account of Joseph. First, we will see how Joseph's brothers have changed since they sold their brother into slavery, and then we will learn about how Joseph forgave his brothers for their hatred. Joseph is a wonderful example of forgiving others and trusting God to work out all troubles for our good. We pray that God would give us strong faith to trust him in all things, as Joseph did.

I know it seems like a while away, but we are already making plans and beginning to work on the music and recitations for the Children's Service. **The service will be held at 7:00pm on Christmas Eve.** If your child is participating in their Sunday School Christmas Eve Service at different church and you would like them to learn those recitations, please give me a copy of what they are learning and have them learn a part of it in place of the Memory Work for the days in December.

To prepare for the Children's Christmas Eve Service, our school children and Sunday School students have combined practices on the Saturdays in December. Please plan to bring your child(ren) to these practices from 9:00-11:00 on December 4, 11, and 18.

Kindergarteners have started learning about Superkid Lily and the letter L. Lily loves to play with her stuffed animal lions.

Our **first graders** are working on two other sounds that the letters ed can make at the end of a word. They have learned that ed can sound like the letter d like it sounds in the word spilled. They also learned it can sound like the letter t as it does in the word cracked. The class received their new list of words last Thursday (11/11) and their next test is scheduled for this week **Wednesday (November 17)**. Their next spelling list will come home by the end of the week.

Second Grade has just started unit 5 in reading. We are learning about the sound the letters aw, au, al, and ay make. Their spelling list focuses on these letter combinations. The next test will be on Tuesday, Nov. 16. On Wednesday we will start our new spelling theme. These words focus on oi, oy, ou, and ow, and will be tested on Tuesday, November 23. Watch for the new list to come home later this week.

In Science class our first and second graders are starting to learn about animal habitats.

Cold weather is coming! Please consider checking to make sure your child has what they need for winter weather outside gear. Students will need boots, snow pants, jackets, hats, and mittens/gloves to be able to play in the snow. We go outside for 2 recesses each day if the temperature is above 0 degrees. Also, once we have snow outside children often have soaked socks when we come inside and change out of their boots. Packing a spare pair of dry socks in their backpack is very helpful!

Don't forget that this week Friday we have chapel in the morning, show-and-tell, and hot lunch. Hot Lunch this week is pizza.
