Their word list will come home tomorrow, it focuses on the "schwa" sound which is the "uh" sound made by the letter a or e.

**The One Hundredth Day of school is tomorrow!** This is a day we set aside our regular classes and focus on activities that go with the number 100. It is a fun day that all the children look forward to. One thing all students will need to bring to school is a collection of 100 things. Children can start thinking about something to bring for the day, count it out, and set it aside for our special day. The collections have to be something they can carry themselves and that fits in their backpacks. We will be using these collections for measuring, weighing, and counting during the day. Some suggestions for their 100 items are: Legos, dried beans, M&M's, toothpicks, pennies, Starburst, seashells, cotton balls, minimarshmallows, etc. Things that roll (marbles) and things that easily get crushed are not as great because they are difficult to work with. Remember, part of the reason they bring a collection is so they can see how much one hundred looks like and practice counting carefully to one hundred. If you find a pack of something that says it has 100 in it, please empty it out and have your child count the items to verify they have exactly 100.

Don't forget we have a short week ahead. The teachers all go to our district teachers' conference on Thursday and Friday, so there is no school on those days.
