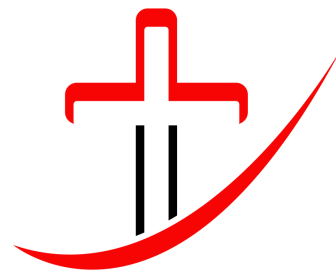
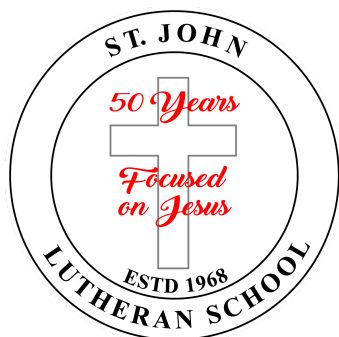

Today is General Pulaski Memorial Day!

In honor of General Casimir Pulaski, a Polish hero of the American Revolution, October 11 is set aside as General Pulaski Memorial Day, a United States observation. This observance is held each year by Presidential

Proclamation to commemorate his death from wounds suffered at the Siege of Savannah on October 9, 1779, and to honor the heritage of Polish Americans.

- The American Revolutionary War lasted for eight years – between April 1775 to September 1783.
- The American Commander in Chief was George Washington.
- British soldiers were known as ‘redcoats’ or ‘devils.’
- Approx 25,000 American Patriots died during military service – the biggest cause of death was disease – often in unsanitary prisoner of war ships.
