Valentine's Day



The letter b starts at the top and bounces like a ball down and around.

Our **first graders** are continuing to learn about some tricky contractions during the first part of the week. Later in the week we will learn about the letter y sounding like a long i or a long e when it is at the end of the word. Because of our short week last week, their spelling test will have more words on it. I am going to give them a mixture new group of words that end with the letter y. Their next test will be on **Friday**, **February 16**.
