
## Mrs. Myslik's K-1 News and Notes

Looking ahead at this week's Bible lessons, we are learning about Israel's first kings, starting with King Saul: the way God chose him and the way he began his reign as a humble and God-fearing king. In our second lesson this week we see how later in his reign as king, Saul fell away from the Lord and no longer was a good leader for the Israelites.
