

## CEA Meeting 9.17.2023 Minutes

**Opening prayer**: Led by Pastor Sargent

<u>Approval of 4.2.23 minutes</u> - No minutes were submitted from the last meeting as no minutes were prepared.

#### <u>Treasurer's Report -</u>

An amount of \$4,647.02 is the current checkbook balance.

A check for \$3,434.00 was written to cover the flooring in the Grades 3 - 5 (now 2 - 4) classroom.

Motion to approve treasurer's report: Beth Kamps, 2<sup>nd</sup> Sue Myslik, Motion approved.

#### School News - Principal's Report

- The new flooring in the Grades 3 5 (now 2 4) classroom looks great, working out well.
- We have three new staff members: Mrs. Hannah Langebartels, part time, in Grades 5 8 on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings. Mrs. Cassie Rawlings is the new teacher in Grades 2 4. Mrs. Lissa Seefeldt is the teachers' aid for three classrooms and works the full day.

#### Classroom News - Teachers

- Mrs. Rohde was unable to attend this meeting.
- Mrs. Myslik A change in the classroom grouping. This year only teaching Kindergarten and Grade 1. There are 15 children this year. Eight students in Kindergarten and seven 1st graders. Working to catch up on the curriculum with the new 1st graders. Planning to go on our annual field trip to the Berryland Pumpkin Patch in Abrams and then Badger Park in Peshtigo with the 4K children on September 27th.
- Mrs. Rawlings Teaching Grades 2 4 this year. Eleven students total, with two in Grade 2, four in Grade 3 and five in Grade 4. So far all is going well. Will also be going on a field trip to Badger Park on September 27th in conjunction with the DNR.
- Mr. Aguilar/Mrs. Langebartels There are fifteen students this year, with Grades 5 8 in the classroom. There is only one student in Grade 5 so that is why the extra grade was added. With four grades in one room, the teachers are finding new ways of teaching this multi-level room. Mrs. Langebartels is settling in well, teaching Christlight and English lessons.

#### Pastor's Report:

- Pastor has thirteen students in his Wednesday confirmation class.
- He would like to get a Newline interactive TV for the Sunday School classes as it is a great blessing in our school classrooms.

#### **Old Business:**

- A back to school swimming party was held on August 27th at Maedke's. \$77.46 was spent on food and drinks for this get together. A motion was made by Sue Myslik to approve this expense, 2nd by Pastor Sargent, all approved.
- A motion was made by Pastor Sargent and 2nd by Lisa Sargent to approve the purchase of doughnuts for this meeting. Total cost was \$25.02.
- The Maedkes were officially thanked for hosting the back to school swimming party.

#### **New Business:**

- <u>School Choice updates</u>: We have 26 students in the Choice program this year.
   It was announced that there will be an increase in the amount per student in voucher payments.
   There are no students on the Choice waiting list which is great news. The audit has been completed.
- <u>Parade</u>: The Peshtigo Historical Day Parade is September 30<sup>th</sup>. Cody will provide the trailer. Zac Hartwig will pull the trailer this year. Motion to approve \$300 for candy from Dave Kamps, 2<sup>nd</sup> Hanna Maedke, all approved.
- <u>Playground Fence</u>: There is a proposal to put fencing around a portion of the playground area. A
  bid from Fortress was received with a \$9,500 \$10,500 quotation, depending on the size of the
  area to be fenced. A decision needs to be made as to where the money to pay for it should
  come from, whether donations or budget money. This will be discussed further at the Board of
  Education.
- <u>CEA Future</u>: We ended with a discussion on the future of the CEA as less parents are attending these meetings. Several points were brought up as to how to possibly solve this problem. One idea is to have brief meetings when we have events such as the Back to School, Fall Gathering or Spring Gathering. Another suggestion is to have Parent Work group sign ups to organize such events. Cody will be stepping down as President of CEA. If we cannot find anyone to take his place, a motion was made by Sue Myslik, and seconded by Dave Kamps to have the Principal act as the Default CEA President for the time being. All approved. We are all encouraged to talk to families of the school and invite them to become active members of the CEA. We will wait to see if there will be a Fall Outing this year.
